Especially Remember.....

Give thanks for the good things we hear about – new births, new jobs, weddings, resolutions to difficult situations, people recovering from illness or even someone just coping better than before. Give thanks that God knows and cares about every detail of life. Pray that those who have sensed God's touch in their lives will stay close to Him and not forget.

Remember all the young people undergoing school, college or university exams. Especially remember those who find this time very stressful. Pray that they would be able to find ways of keeping calm and focussed while studying. Pray also for young people who are looking for jobs. Pray that they will all know that God has a plan for them, a good plan to give them a future and a hope.

Give thanks for the chaplaincy work in Merrylee Primary and Hillpark Secondary and for the schools' openness in working with the chaplaincy team and volunteers. Pray that this work will bear much fruit, in the lives of pupils and teachers.

Pray for those who have uncertainty in their lives, and who are unsure what the future holds for them in terms of work, health, or relationships. Pray that they can put their trust in God, to believe that God has a plan for them too. Pray that they find peace in their hearts as they wait.

Pray for elderly members of our congregations who are becoming increasingly frail and are finding life difficult. Pray for their safety and well-being. Pray that they may receive the practical support they need from family or from care agencies. Pray too that in frailty or in confusion, they may draw close to the God who knows them, and understands them and loves them.

Very often, we are unaware of the burdens those in our congregations carry silently. Pray that each of us might be sensitive to those around us. Pray for the people who sit beside you in church, those you meet in the street or in the groups you attend. Ask God to meet their unspoken needs.

Give thanks for the people who are a blessing to you – for those who have said a kind word, for those who have been an encouragement to you, for those who brighten your day!

National and World Events

Pray for the political leaders of the UK and Scotland as they try to guide our nations through Brexit negotiations, and other national and international crises.

Pray for local politicians as they seek to ensure that scarce resources are targeted fairly towards public services that are stretched and face increasing demands. Pray especially for those at the sharp end of health and social care pressures, whether as managers, staff or service users.

Pray for Christians who are persecuted in all corners of the world, and for organisations like Open Doors who support them. Especially pray for the persecutors and their victims in their highest priority countries: North Korea, Afghanistan, Somalia, Sudan, and Pakistan.

Pray for those caught up in people-trafficking and modern-day slavery, across the world and even in our own city. You could focus on the sex slavery which is rife in Nigeria and Libya, with kidnappings of young women continuing regularly.

Continue to pray for refugees everywhere, whether in camps or in even more precarious circumstances. Ask God to give world leaders the will and wisdom to find lasting solutions.

Pray for the plans for talks between North Korea, South Korea and the US. Pray that they may take place and bear real fruit in defusing tension and reducing the threat of armed conflict.
